GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO BBA

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) programme was introduced by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla in the University College of Business Studies with the objective of training and meeting man power requirements for junior management positions. Adhering to the similar guidelines and in consonance with the pattern laid down by the HP University we are offering this most desirable and in demand programme at your doorstep.

The total duration of BBA Course is three years that is spread over a period of six semesters. There shall be an examination at the end of each semester termed as End Semester Examination (ESE) in which whole of the syllabus will be incorporated.

At Government College Nalagarh, we have a total number of 50 seats in the Department of BBA which are only under Subsidized pattern.:

1. SUBSIDIZED SEATS 50 SEATS

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR BBA

Aspirants seeking admission to Three Year Full-time BBA Programme should meet the following requirements/criteria as has been specified by the HP University and adopted by the Institute as the basic parameters of Admission.

BASIS OF ADMISSION:

1. Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board of School Education /CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, with 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Or

2. Any examination of a Board/University/School in a Foreign Country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalent committee or on the recommendation of Association of Indian university, with 50% marks (45% in case of SC/ST).

AGE LIMIT FOR BBA:

The maximum age limit for BBA course is 23 years (25 years for girls) as on 01-07-2023. However, in case of candidates belonging to scheduled castes / scheduled tribes, there will be a relaxation of three years. The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit an age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months.

Admission to BBA shall be subject to the following conditions:

- Admission shall be made on the basis of Merit determined on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 examination.

- A candidate with Commerce or Mathematics at plus two level will be given additional 10% of the percentage marks obtained in plus two, while computing merit for admission.
- In case of a tie the percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in matriculation will be considered, and if again a tie takes place the candidate older in age will be given preference.

Note:- The above norms are however subject to change as per HPU/HP Govt. instructions.

4. At least 75% attendance is compulsory for appearing in End Semester Examination (ESE).
5. Taking the House Test and submitting the Assignments/Project is compulsory for all.
6. Internal Assessment is based on Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) pattern.

DRESS CODE

A formal dress code implies cultivation of special attitude among students; so as to embolden them with an elite appearance and to add vibrant colors to their persona.

Adhering to the norms of approved dress code is mandatory.

Dress Code: Plain GreyShirt and Black Trousers.

Note: Dress Code is mandatory for all days except Wednesday and Saturday. On these two days students are free to wear dress of their choice. However, the dress should be decent and modest in appearance.

ATTENDANCE & CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) & END SEMESTER EXAMINATION (ESE)

1. A student has to attend a minimum of 75% lectures in each course in Theory and Practical separately, otherwise his/ her Examination form will not be forwarded to the University. If he / she does not attend a class for 10 continuous days or absents himself / herself for more than 10 days his/her name shall be struck-off from the college rolls. Student can seek re-admission within 3 days from the date his / her name is struck-off by paying Rs.2000/- as a fine for the first time and for the second time fine amount would be Rs 3000/-. Furthermore, an undertaking from parents will also be taken in presence of Head of Institution/Committee Members that if his / her ward does not complete 75% lectures then his / her examination form will not be forwarded to the University.
2. The Fine Charges (for absence without a duly sanctioned Leave) will be @ Rs.05 per period for theory class/per subject and Rs.10 per practical lab.
3. The Fine Charges for absence from Mid-Term (MTT Exam) will be @ Rs. 50/-.Whereas, fine for not wearing dress (as per approved dress code) will be Rs. 50 per day
4. Provided that in the case of a candidate provisionally admitted to a higher class, but reverted to the lower class, as provided herein after, this condition shall only be required to be fulfilled in respect of attendances or assignments as the case may be from the date of his reversion to the lower class.
5. NCC and NSS enrolled students are required to undergo NCC and NSS training or other activity approved by the university. 75 per cent attendance, at such training or participation in such activities shall be compulsory: Provided that the Head of the Institution may for reasons to be recorded in writing can condone the absence up to an extent of 15 % of the total attendance.
6. Provided further that the Principal may for reasons to be recorded in writing can condone shortage of lectures delivered in each of the concerned courses up to a maximum of 10 per cent lectures in Theory and Practicals.
7. Absence from lectures, tutorials, seminars, practicals on account of participation in the University, State, Inter-University, National, International tournaments, Youth Festivals and cultural and any other sports activities or N.C.C., N.S.S. camps including the actual time spent of Journey, therefore shall deemed to be attendance for the purpose. However, the absence shall not exceed 20% of Lectures delivered.
8. Fee once deposited shall not be refunded.

CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA)

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course;

1. Mid-Term (Minor) Test – There will be one mid-term test; to be conducted when approximately 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This mid-term test will be of 15 marks weightage. Mid-term test will be conducted by the college House Exam Committee in consultation with the Principal and concerned Teachers
2. Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper–The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/ assignment/term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.
3. Attendance: The remaining 5 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of attendance of students in the class.

END SEMESTER EXAMINATION (ESE)

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an End-Semester Examination (ESE) that will be of three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note: Only those students will be allowed to appear in the ESE who have been successful in the CCA.

A student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCA and ESE) separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

Discipline is an indispensable part of every educational institution. In our college we lay great emphasis on maintaining discipline in the college premises. The following points are to be kept in mind by all the students.

Students are expected to show due respect to teachers and courtesy to employees of college. Students should abstain from bringing outsiders to the college campus.

Consumption of tobacco, pan- para etc. and smoking is strictly banned in the college premises. Any student found smoking in the college campus or in the hostel premises will be fined Rs. 500/- and may also face expulsion.

Proper care of college property – furniture, walls, windows etc. must be taken by all the students. Students found indulging in vandalism are liable of heavy fines and / or rustication from the college.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps is statutory organization functioning under the Ministry of Defence, Government of India. Over the last 60 years the Corps has evolved itself as the biggest uniform youth organizations in the world crossing all boundaries of caste, creed, sex and society symbolizing the state motto of **'Unity and Discipline'**. The Corps aims to develop qualities of leadership, character building and good citizenship amongst the youth of our country. In our Institution the NCC unit is functioning under 1 HP Boys/ Girls BN NCC Solan. Besides the scheduled NCC activities, these units help in spreading the message of Zero Tolerance towards Ragging, awareness on social issues and sensitization on eco-friendly initiatives in formal and informal meetings.

The students of BCA and PGDCA can join NCC by filling the enrolment form which can be obtained from the NCC office for a period of two years. During this training can obtain 'BEE and CEE certificates.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme is a life line of any educational institution. It inculcates the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interaction. It brings academic institution closer to the society. In fact the motto of NSS is **'Not Me but You'** It stands for the following two ideas:

- to forget and surrender the self and
- to render selfless service to the Society/ Nation

NSS teaches the students to become socially aware and play a constructive role in the development of society. Enrolment in NSS is done through a procedural and approved selection mode. The students interested in joining NSS can contact the NSS In-charge of the Institution for getting themselves enrolled in this esteemed Organization.

ROVERS AND RANGERS

The college is affiliated to the state association of Rovers and Rangers. Boys and Girls are enrolled every year as Rovers and Rangers respectively. The students are trained to serve community, society and humanity. **'Love, Unity and Mutual Brotherhood'** is the main motto of Rovers and Rangers.

SPORTS

College life would be indeed lifeless without sports activities; hence the college calendar gives great importance to various activities of Sports. We have the proud privilege of representing the University and State in many National and Zonal level Sports Competitions. From time to time the college students participate in various sports activities like: Boxing, Cricket, Judo, Kabaddi, and Badminton etc. that are conducted by the University/State bodies. Annual Athletic meet is organized by the Department of Physical Education.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

Meritorious students and students excelling in co- curricular activities, sports are given prizes at the end of t session in Annual Prize Distribution Function.

Those students would qualify for Annual Prizes who have passed all optional and compulsory subjects.

He / She must secure at least C grade/above 5.0 SGPA in the subject for which the prize is being given.

Students who hold position in the University merit list are given Special Prizes.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college publishes its magazine '**PARBAT REKHA**' annually to provide a platform to the budding writer so as give them an opportunity to explore and fortify their flair for creative writing. Through this magazine the young minds give vent to their thoughts and perceptions.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

There are over 16,000 books in the college library, related to different subjects taught in the college. In addition to this, there is a regular subscription of various newspapers (Hindi and English) and magazines and journals for the benefit of students and teachers. From this academic session Book – Bank facility is being provided to the poor students who are unable to buy books. Under this scheme they would be issued books from college library for the full academic session by depositing a meagre amount of security.

PARENT TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (PTA)

To encourage community participation in education a Parent – Teacher Association was established in the Academic Session 2004-2005. Election to PTA executive body is held regularly every year. In addition to it the parents are welcome to visit the college anytime to inquire about the progress of their wards. They are also advised to attend the Annual Meetings of PTA as and when held. An advance notice about this meeting is affixed on the college notice board and the students are also notified about it through the regular classes.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND JOB PLACEMENT CELL

The Cell sensitizes the students about myriad career avenues available to them in their respective fields and also enables them to seek job placement in various government, non-government and private enterprises. To achieve these ends lectures by the experts and concerned officials are also arranged for students on regular basis.

HOSTELS

The college has a boys and a girls hostel. Boys' hostel has a capacity of 99 beds whereas; the girls hostel has 108 beds. The students who apply for hostel accommodation must adhere to the following rules and instructions.

1. A student can apply for hostel accommodation only after he/she is admitted to the college.
2. Admission forms for hostel accommodation are available in the college office.
3. Students will be admitted to the hostel on first come first serve basis.
4. The recommendation of concerned Wardens is necessary for admission to the hostels.
5. The room will be allotted on a due date by the authorities.
6. The residents of the hostel are not permitted to change the room allotted to them without prior permission of the warden.
7. Fresh admission to the hostel will have to be sought in every academic year.
8. Every boarder shall have to abide by the time–schedule as laid down from time to time.
9. No guest can stay in the hostel without prior permission of the Warden.
10. The general discipline rules of the college shall be applicable to the boarders as well.
11. Any other rule and regulation as may be deemed necessary by the Principal according to the circumstances are to be observed by the resident scholars/boarders.
12. Hostel students will not indulge in any act that may come under the definition of ragging; they will not participate in acts of ragging or abet ragging in any form.
13. At the time of admission at least one of the parents must accompany the ward.
14. Visiting hours : Sunday / Holiday : 10:00 AM to 05:00 PM
On Working Days : 03:00 PM to 05:00 PM
15. Visitors are not allowed to enter the students' rooms. They can meet their wards only in the visitor room.

Important University / College Rules for Strict Compliance

- (i) All the students are hereby advised to take admission as per the admission schedule.
- (ii) Students found making use of mobiles in classrooms are liable to pay fine or face suspension from the classes.
- (iii) Smoking in college campus is strictly prohibited by law and any student found smoking, will be fined up to Rs.500/- and may even face expulsion or rustication from the college.
- (iv) Ragging (like introduction) in any form inside the campus or on approach road (s)

leading to college campus is a crime and will entail heavy fines and even expulsion or other actions as recommended by the Government of India.

- (v) Each and every student will have to give an undertaking (as given in the prospectus) certifying that He/She will not indulge in acts of Ragging in any way whatsoever.
- (vi) Crowding, standing in corridors causes disturbance in classes, hence students are advised to not to do the same.
- (vii) Only those functions can be held in college campus (premises and ground) which are organized or allowed by the college authorities/administration. Such functions should also be completed within a definite time-frame and permission must be sought for them well in advance.
- (viii) Pasting of unauthorized posters in the college, writing on the walls, blackboards, notice boards is strictly prohibited. A student bringing outsiders in the college campus will be severely punished. Outsiders are not allowed to roam about in the college campus.
- (ix) The use of alcohol and drugs is strictly prohibited. Any student found using or having used drinks, drugs or any other intoxicants will be summarily dismissed from the college.
- (x) A student who remains absent from the college for more than ten days without prior sanction of the Principal, will no more remain on the college-rolls. A student whose name is struck off twice from the college-rolls will not be readmitted.

It is mandatory to carry your identity card with you in the college. It will have to be produced whenever asked for, by the Prinscipal or by any Teacher. Failure to do so may entail disciplinary.
