Note:- Admission to these course is entirely separate to the admission in other courses running in the college. No student can take admission simultaneously in this course when he/she is enrolled in anyregular course run by any institute. Student is eligible for only one course at a time. He/ She may be awarded **Certificate** ,**Diploma** and **Advanced Diploma Course** after completing **6** months, **one** year and **two** years course respectively.

COURSES OFFERED UNDER COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHEME:-ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN HOSPITALITY & TOURISM

(NOTE:- Vocational /skill component of these courses /programmes will be confirmed to the NVEQF/NSQF and general education component will be confirmed by our college. Skill/ vocational component of the courses will be Employment Oriented and Credit Based. Banking of the credits will be permitted so as to enable multiple entry & exit).

Entrance to Vocational Courses Under CC - Scheme / B. Voc Degree

Category 1:- Students already acquired NSQF certification Level 4 in particular industry sector. Category 2:- Students who have aquired NSQF certification Level 4 but may like to change their tradeand may enter into skill based courses in a different trade.

Category 3:- Students passed 10+2 examination with conventional schooling without any background of vocational training.

Entry: At least 10+2 or equivalent certificate along with certificate for meeting the learning outcomes of the vocational/skill components of Level to -4 under NSQF.

Number of Seats recommended: 50 Seats in the Course i.e. Advanced Diploma in Hospitality & Tourism has been recommended by the expert committee of the UGC. 20 Seats in the course has been passed in management quota by BOM meeting on 26 June 2018.

Admission Criteria:-

- 1. Candidate must be 10+2 Pass or equivalent in any stream.
- 2. Admission is purely on the merit basis of entrance exam.
- 3. Reservation of seats as per State/HPU-Shimla roster.
- 4. Any +2 Pass Candidate from any Board can get admission in these courses. Preference will be given to local Himachali students. Students from other States shall be preferred as per availability of seats.
- 5. Parents/guardian must accompany the student at the time of filling admission form.

- 1. Photocopy of Matric & 10+2 Certificate
- 2. Photocopy of IRDP
- 3. Photocopy of SC/ST Certificate.
- 4. Photocopy of Himachali Bonafide Certificate.
- 5. Two Pass Port Size & One Stamp Size photograph
- 6. Affidavit from the students on Rs. 3/- Stamp Paper

Fee for the courses:- UGC Seats

- 1. Rs 4000/- per semester for every course and Rs. 2000/- per semester as CC Development Fees
- 2. Rs 8,000/- for One Year i.e. for Diploma course and Rs. 4000/- per semester as CC Development Fees
- 3. Rs 16,000/- for two years i.e. Advanced Diploma Course and Rs. 8000/- per semester as CC Development Fees
- 4. Rs 200/- Re-appear (if a student does not attain minimum passing marks i.e. 35% in theory examination)

Fee for the courses under Management Quota Seats

- a. **Rs. 4000/-** per semester for every course and **Rs. 2000/-** per semester as CC Development fund and **Rs. 4000/-** management quota fees.
- b. **Rs. 8000/-** per semester for every course and **Rs. 4000/-** per semester as CC Development fund and **Rs. 8000/-** management quota fees.
- c. **Rs. 16000/-** per semester for every course and **Rs. 8000/-** per semester as CC Development fund and **Rs. 16000/-** management quota fees.

Students will not be charged any examination fee but in case of re-appear & re-evaluation, he/she will be charged Rs. 200 /- & Rs. 100/- respectively. Also in case of assessment of skill component by the Sector Skill Council of Hospitality & Tourism the assessment fee for the 1st time will be paid by the students.

Fine for the courses:-

If student remain absent from the theory classes for more than 10 days in a month without prior information his name will be struck off form the college roll. She/he will be charged Rs. 100/- as Re-admission charges (Relaxation shall be given to the on job students. But he/she has to inform in writing in advance about his/her job place)

EXAMINATION PROCEDURE & EVALUATION/ASSESSMENT PROCEDUREOF THE COURSES:-

Academic Assessment / Evaluation is to be done at college level. Community College has its academic linkage with MTA Department of HPU, UIHTM department of Punjab University. These institutes render their services in setting question paper, evaluation & designing curriculum of the courses etc. Skill part of the courses is assessed & certified by the respective SSCs (i.e. Sector Skill Councils of Life Sciences and Hospitality & Tourism) in each course (i.e. Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma) 60% credits are given to Skill component & 40% credits to theory component. College follows the guidelines of UGC and respective Sector Skill Councils (SSCs) for the assessment/Evaluation.
