GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO BCA

Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) is three years under graduate course spread over six semesters under self financing scheme. At Government College Nalagarh, we have a total number of 50 seats in the Department of BCA which are distributed as into two distinct categories:

The admission to the course is open under two categories

1. Subsidized Category 25 seats

Non-Subsidized (NRI's/NRI Sponsored/Foreign 25 seats
 Nationals/on payment of seats) category.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITION FOR BCA

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board / CBSE / ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla -5,

with 40% Marks (35% marks for SC / ST category), shall be eligible.

AGE LIMIT FOR BCA

The maximum age limit for the course is 21 years for male candidates of general category 23 years for female candidates of general category and 24 years for both male and female candidates of SC/ST category as on 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO PGDCA

The duration for PGDCA is one year, spread over in two semesters and examination will be held at the end of the each semester

The total number of seats in PGDCA course are 20 distributed as follows:

1. Subsidized Category 10 seats

Non-Subsidized (NRI's/NRI Sponsored/Foreign 10 seats
 Nationals/On payment of seats) category.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITION FOR PGDCA

Any graduate from the recognized university or its equivalent with at least 50% marks or 5.0 CGPA (45% or 4.5 CGPA in case of SC/ST Candidates)

AGE LIMIT FOR PGDCA

Candidates seeking admission in PGDCA programme should not be more than 26 year (28 year for girls) of age as on Ist July of the year concerned whereas relaxation in upper age limit will be of three years to the SC/ST candidates. Under H.P. University ordinance 3.3(A), Vice- Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reasons to be recorded in writing up to maximum of six months.

BASIS OF ADMISSION FOR BCA AND PGDCA

(Subsidized and Non-Subsidized)

The admission will be purely on merit basis. Separate merit list shall be prepared for subsidized category and non-subsidized category. The 25 subsidized seats for BCA and 10 subsidized seats for PGDCA would be filled first and the remaining 25 seats for BCA and 10 for PGDCA in non-subsidized category would be filled after all the seats in subsidized categories are filled.

The non-subsidized seats will be applicable to NRI's/NRI sponsored/Foreign Nationals/Payment category.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats as per Government and HPU norms 120 points roaster will be applied for making admission in the academic session 2023-24.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION FOR PGDCA

English shall be the medium of instructions and examination. The examination for PGDCA will be on semester pattern. Each theory paper shall be of 3 hours duration and shall carry 100 marks (75 mark for written semester examination and 25 marks for internal assessment). In all, eight questions will be set, 3 from PART-A and 4 from PART-B of the syllabus. Question No. 8 will be an objective/short answer type question. Examinees will attempt five questions in all. Two each from PART-A and PART-B. Question No. 8 will be compulsory. There will be a project work of 200 marks in 2nd Semester. The project should involve development of application software for some industry/institute.

ATTENDANCE & CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT

(i). A student has to attend a minimum of 75% lectures in each course in Theory and Practical separately, otherwise his/ her Examination form will not be forwarded to the University. If he / she does not attend a class for 10 continuous days or absent himself/herself for more than 10 days his/her name shall be struck off from the college rolls. Student can seek re–admission within 3 days from the date his / her name is struck off by paying Rs.2000/- as a fine for first time and second time the fine would be Rs

- 3000/-. Simultaneously undertaking from parents will be taken in presence of Head of Institution that if his / her ward does not complete 75% lectures then his / her examination form will not be forwarded to the University.
- (ii). The Fine charges (for absence without a duly sanctioned leave) will be @ Rs. 5 per period for theory subject and will be 10 Rs. Per practical Lab.
- (iii). The Fine Charges for absence from Mid-Term(MTT Exam) will be @ Rs. 50/- wheras fine for not wearing dress(as per dress code) will be Rs. 50 per day.
- (iv) Provided that in the case of a candidate provisionally admitted to a higher class, but reverted to the lower class, as provided herein after, this condition shall only be required to be fulfilled in respect of attendances or assignments as the case may be from the date of his reversion to the lower class.
- (v) NCC and NSS enrolled students are required to undergo NCC and NSS training or other activity approved by the university. 75 per cent attendance, at such training or participation in such activity shall be compulsory: Provided that the head of the institution may for reason to be recorded in writing condone absence upto an extentof 15 % of the total attendances.
- (vi) Fee once deposited shall not be refunded.
- (vii) Absence from lectures, tutorials, seminars, practicals on account of participation in the University, State, Inter-University, National, International touraments, Youth Festivals and Cultural and any other sportts activities or N.C.C., N.S.S. Camps inleuding the actual time spent of Journey, therfore shall be deemed to be attandance for the purpose. However, the absence shall not exceed 20% of Lectured Delivered.

CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA)

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in acourse;

1. **Mid-Term (Minor) Test** – There will be one mid-term test; to be conducted when approximately 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This mid-term test will be of 15 marks

weightage. Mid-term test will be conducted by the college House Exam Committee in consultation with the Principal and concerned Teachers

- 2. **Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper**—The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/ assignment/term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.
- 3. **Attendance:** The remaining 5 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of attendance of students in the class.

END SEMESTER EXAMINATION (ESE)

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end-semester examination(ESE) that will be of three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note:

Only those students will be allowed to appear in the ESE who have been successful in the CCA.

A student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCA and ESE) separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

Discipline is an indispensable part of every educational institution. In our college we lay great emphasis on maintaining discipline in the college premises. The following points are to be kept in mind by all the students.

- Students are expected to show due respect to teachers and courtesy to employees of college.
- Students should abstain from bringing outsiders to the college campus.
- Consumption of tobacco, pan- parag etc. and smoking is strictly banned in the
 college premises. Any student found smoking in the college campus or in the
 hostel premises will be fined Rs. 500/- and may also face expulsion.
- Proper care of college property furniture, walls, windows etc. must be taken

by all the students. Students found indulging in vandalism are liable of heavy fines and / or rustication from the college.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps is statutory organization functioning under the Ministry of Defence, Government of India. Over the last 60 years the Corps has evolved itself as the biggest uniform youth organizations in the world crossing all boundaries of caste, creed, sex and society symbolizing the state motto of 'Unity and Discipline'. The Corps aims to develop qualities of leadership, character building and good citizenship amongst the youth of our country. In our Institution the NCC unit is functioning under 1 HP Boys/ Girls BN NCC Solan. Besides the scheduled NCC activities, these units help in spreading the message of Zero Tolerance towards Ragging, awareness on social issues and sensitization on eco-friendly initiatives in formal and informal meetings.

The students of BCA and PGDCA can join NCC by filling the enrolment form which can be obtained from the NCC office for a period of two years. During this training they can obtain 'BEE and CEE' certificates.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme is a life line of any educational institution. It inculcates the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interaction. It brings academic institution closer to the society. In fact the motto of NSS is 'Not Me but You' It stands for the following two ideas:

- i) To forget and surrender the self and
- ii) To render selfless service to the Society/ Nation

NSS teaches the students to become socially aware and play a constructive role in the development of society. Enrolment in NSS is done through a procedural and approved selection mode. The students interested in joining NSS can contact the NSS in-charge of the Institution for getting themselves enrolled in this esteemed Organization.

ROVERS AND RANGERS

The college is affiliated to the state association of Rovers and Rangers. Boys and Girls are enrolled every year as Rovers and Rangers respectively. The students are trained to serve community, society and humanity. 'Love, Unity and Mutual Brotherhood' is the main motto of Rovers and Rangers.

SPORTS

College life would be indeed lifeless without sports activities; hence the college calendar gives great importance to various activities of Sports. We have the proud privilege of representing the University and State in many National and Zonal level Sports Competitions. From time to time the college students participate in various sports activities like: Boxing, Cricket, Judo, Kabaddi, and Badminton etc. that are conducted by the University/State bodies. Annual Athletic meet is organized by the Department of Physical Education every year with full colors.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

- Meritorious students and students excelling in co- curricular activities, sports are given prizes at the end oftsession in Annual Prize Distribution Function.
- Those students would qualify for Annual Prizes who have passed all optional and compulsory subjects.
- He / She must secure at least C grade/above 5.0 SGPA in the subject for which the prize is beinggiven. Students who hold position in the University merit list are given Special Prizes.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college publishes its magazine 'PARBAT REKHA' annually to provide a platform to the budding writer so as give them an opportunity to explore and fortify their flair for creative writing. Through this magazine the young minds give vent to their thoughts and perceptions.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

There are over 16,000 books in the college library, related to different subjects taught in the college. In addition to this, there is a regular subscription of various newspapers (Hindi and English) and magazines and journals for the benefit of students and teachers. From this academic session Book – Bank facility is being provided to the poor students who are unable to buy books. Under this scheme they would be issued books from college library for the full academic session by depositing a meagre amount of security.

PARENT TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (PTA)

To encourage community participation in education a Parent – Teacher Association was established in the Academic Session 2004-2005. Election to PTA executive body is held regularly every year. In addition to it the parents are welcome to visit the college anytime to inquire about the progress of their wards. They are also advised to attend the Annual Meetings of PTA as and when held. An advance notice about this meeting is affixed on the college notice board and the students are also notified about it through the regular classes.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND JOB PLACEMENT CELL

The Cell sensitizes the students about myriad career avenues available to them in their respective fields and also enables them to seek job placement in various government, non-government and private enterprises. To achieve these ends lectures by the experts and concerned officials are also arranged for students on regular basis.

HOSTELS

The College has hostels for boys as well as girls. The capacity of Boys hostels is 99 beds and that of Girls hostel is 108 beds. The students who apply for hostel accommodation must adhere to the following rules and instructions:-

- 1. A student can apply for hostel accommodation, after he/she is admitted in the college.
- 2. Admission forms for hostel accommodation are available in the College Office.

- 3. Students will be admitted to the hostel on first come first serve basis.
- 4. The recommendation of Warden is necessary for admission to the hostel.
- 5. The room will be allotted on a due date by the authorities.
- 6. The general discipline requirement of the College shall be applicable to boarders as well.
- 7. Any other rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary by the Principal according to the circumstances are to be observed by the resident scholars/boarders.
- 8. Hostel students will not indulge in any act that may come under the definition of ragging.
- 9. The residents of the hostel are not permitted to change the room allotted to them without prior permission of the Warden.
- 10. Fresh admission to the hostel will have to be sought in every academic year.
- 11. Every boarder shall have to abide by time–schedule as laid down from time to time.
- 12. No guest can stay in the hostel without prior permission of the Warden.

Important University / College Rules for Strict Compliance

- a) Students are directed to switch off their mobile phones as and when they the enter class rooms. Playing music and songs on mobile phones that is likely to create disturbance is strictly prohibited. Student found indulging in such practices shall be penalized.
- b) Use of Tobacco products is banned under COPTA2003 (Cigarette & other Tobacco Products Act, 2003). If someone is found using these products, he/she will be penalized under the Act.
- c) Ragging in any form inside the campus or on approach road (s) leading to College campus is a crime and will lead to heavy fines and even expulsion or other actions as recommended by Govt. of India. Each and every student will have to give undertaking (given in prospectus) not to indulge in ragging of any kind.

- d) Crowding / standing in corridors causes disturbance in classes, hence students are advised to not to do the same.
- e) Only those functions can be held in College campus (premises and ground) which are organized or allowed by the college authorities. Such function must be completed in definite time frame for which permission is granted.
- f) Pasting of unauthorized posters in the College, writing on the walls, blackboards, notice boards is strictly prohibited.
- g) A student bringing outsiders in the College campus will be severely punished. Outsiders are not allowed to roam about in the College campus.
- h) Use of alcohol and drugs is strictly prohibited. Any student found indulging in it will be penalized.
- i) 75% attendance in each course, theory & practical separately is compulsory for being eligible to appear in End Term Examination of University.
- j) The name of the student who remains absent from the College for more than ten days without prior sanction of the Principal, will be struck off from the College Rolls.
- k) A student whose name is struck off twice from the College Rolls will not be readmitted.
- 1) The absentee fine for one period is Rs. 5.00/- & for one practical is Rs. 10.00/- . Students are required to get prior leave sanction in case they have to be absent from the College. The leave application must be countersigned by parents or guardians. In case of long sick leave a medical certificate is to be attached.
- m) It is mandatory to carry your identity card with you in the College. It will have to be produced whenever asked for.
- n) In case of loss of Identity Card, student will have to file an FIR in the Police Station and apply for issuance of duplicate Identity Card along with the copy of the FIR for which Rs. 20/- will be charged.
- **o)** No student will be allowed to join two full time regular Degree Courses of study simultaneously.

All students of the college are expected to observe the following guidelines in the larger interest of the institution:


- ♣ To understand, appreciate and follow the vision and goals of the institution.


